



Tips for Creating Awesome Electronic Job Descriptions

How to Ensure that Our JD Parser
Can Read Your Job Descriptions with Perfection?

Unfortunately, many recruiters do not pay attention to the fact that the job descriptions need to be understood by a JD parser. Creating visually aesthetic job descriptions holds no value if they fail to comply with the benchmark of getting read through a JD parser.

A JD parser can easily understand a job description that follows all the set guidelines. Let's check out some tips for creating perfect job descriptions.

1. Fix the Conversion Issue

A JD parser starts parsing with the text that it gets from document conversion or direct text input.

Make sure that your job descriptions do not include the following:

- Scanned PDF-Scanned documents are difficult to parse as they depend on OCR conversion, and most of the time, OCR conversion may not be 100% accurate
- Corrupted PDF
- Password Protected PDF
- Jumbled data
- Non-text format PDF
- If your job description is in Word document, make sure it doesn't include frame/textboxes as they create issues with text conversion.

2. Tables

We all believe that putting information in tables will make it look organized. However, a JD parser faces issues when it is put in the following way:

Parallel information appears

Example:

Job Profile JobCode Salary	Software Developer Jo11102 USD 45000
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This information will appear as below and cannot be parsed.

Job Profile

JobCode

Salary

Software Developer

Jo11102

USD 45000

3. Hidden Fields

Do not use the following in the job description:

- Document property fields
- Any hidden data in document

4. Case Sensitivity

Case sensitivity matters a lot in extracting entities like Job Title, Organization name, Person name etc. They must start with capital letters.

5. Boundary Separation

Please keep in mind the following tips while writing a job description.

- Entities or blocks should be separated from each other.
- Text should be written with proper line breaks.

e.g.

WRONG

Salary : not Disclosed Job Code: 012812182

RIGHT

Salary: not Disclosed

Job Code: 012812182

or

Salary: not Disclosed

Job Code: 012812182

6. Proper Keywords and Headings

It is always advisable to write keywords in front of the entity values. Our JD parser might not be able to extract some entities if not written with a keyword. Also, try to use a simple keyword/heading than combined multiple keywords or complex keywords.

e.g PostOnDate, CloseDate, Bill Rate, Interview timing, Interview place, etc.

7. Ambiguous Information

Do not write duplicate information. Our software will pick only one value depending on the algorithm.

e.g.

UI Developer

2-6 years

2,00,000-5,00,000 P.A.

Bhopal, Indore
